Acts 10:1 At Caesarea there was a man named Cornelius, a centurion of what was known as the Italian Cohort. 2 a devout man who feared God with all his household, gave alms generously to the people, and prayed continually to God. **3** About the ninth hour of the day he saw clearly in a vision an angel of God come in and say to him, "Cornelius." 4 And he stared at him in terror and said, "What is it, Lord?" And he said to him, "Your prayers and your alms have ascended as a memorial before God. 5 And now send men to loppa and bring one Simon who is called Peter. 6 He is lodging with one Simon, a tanner, whose house is by the sea." 7 When the angel who spoke to him had departed, he called two of his servants and a devout soldier from among those who attended him, 8 and having related everything to them, he sent them to Joppa.... Sermon Notes

Big Idea:

For Reflection and Application:

Monday:

Read Acts 10:1-48. List all the momentous things that happen in this story.

Tuesday:

Reread Acts 10:1-3, 9-11. Both Cornelius and Peter receive a vision from God. What were they doing when they received this vision? Why is this significant?

Wednesday:

In Acts 10:1-48, what if Cornelius and/or Peter had not taken the time to pray? What might they have missed?

Thursday:

In Acts 10:1-48, both Cornelius and Peter seem to be listening and receptive to God in their prayer time. To what extent are you receptive? How can you be more so?

Friday:

Read Psalm 46:10; Isaiah 30:15; Mark 6:30-32. What is the value in being still and silent and listening before God? Why is this often difficult?
