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## Sermon Notes

**Micah 6:1-8** Hear what the Lord says:  
Arise, plead your case before the  
mountains, and let the hills hear your  
voice. <sup>2</sup>Hear, you mountains, the  
indictment of the LORD, and you enduring  
foundations of the earth, for the LORD has  
an indictment against his people, and he  
will contend with Israel. <sup>3</sup>"O my people,  
what have I done to you? How have I  
wearied you? Answer me! <sup>4</sup>For I brought  
you up from the land of Egypt and  
redeemed you from the house of slavery,  
and I sent before you Moses, Aaron, and  
Miriam. <sup>5</sup>O my people, remember what  
Balak king of Moab devised, and what  
Balaam the son of Beor answered him,  
and what happened from Shittim to Gilgal,  
that you may know the righteous acts of  
the LORD." <sup>6</sup>"With what shall I come before  
the LORD, and bow myself before God on  
high? Shall I come before him with burnt  
offerings, with calves a year old? <sup>7</sup>Will the  
LORD be pleased with thousands of rams,  
with ten thousands of rivers of oil? Shall I  
give my firstborn for my transgression, the  
fruit of my body for the sin of my soul?"  
<sup>8</sup>He has told you, O man, what is good;  
and what does the LORD require of you but  
to do justice, and to love kindness, and to  
walk humbly with your God? ESV

### Big Idea:

#### **Micah 6:8**

He has shown you, O man, what is good; and  
what does the Lord require of you but to do  
justly, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with  
your God? NKJV

# For Reflection & Application:

## Monday:

Read Micah 6:1-5. Prior to this passage, we know that the people were going thru struggles and chose to complain and rebel against God. Did the people have a strong case against God? Should they be upset or thankful toward God?

## Tuesday:

Read Micah 6:6-8. What is the bottom line of how God wants us to live? What does it mean to “do justice”? Is it doing what is right according to what we think, or according to what God says is right? How can we determine what God says is the right way?

## Wednesday:

Read Psalm 23, Lamentations 3:22-23, Psalm 63:3. How do those passages describe God’s lovingkindness? In our closest relationships, do we love in a way that reflects God’s lovingkindness? How can we love in a way that can only come from God?

## Thursday:

Read Psalm 51:16-17 & Micah 6:6-8. Do you see the similarities in these passages regarding walking humbly before God? If we hold on to our ways and our “comfort level”, are we being humble before God? Does being humble before God mean that I trust that His ways are better than my ways, and I trust that His power can enable me to live as He directs?

## Friday:

Read Micah 6:8 again. How do the three things listed support each other? How can I experience the life that God wants for me?

## Daily Prayer:

Heavenly Father, I thank You for rescuing me from sin, and for the many times You have been there for me in my life. I am tired of doing things my way and I am ready to experience the life that You want for me. Lord, help me to be more humble, so that I will trust You with my whole heart. I want to walk with You each and every day, that I may learn to see things the way You see them, and care about what You care about, and love the way that You love. Please show me the right path and give me the strength that I need to walk it. I want to love others with Your lovingkindness, especially those who are closest to me, that they may feel the comfort, security, and joy of a love that only You can provide. Thank You Lord, for Your lovingkindness in my life.
