For Reflection and Application:

Monday:

Read Jeremiah 22:3. Is doing justice optional for the believer in Jesus?

Tuesday:

How would you define social justice? How would you define worship? How are the two related?

Wednesday:

Read Genesis I. From a biblical point of view, who or what is the source of our identity and purpose? Why is this important? How does being made in the image of God relate to social justice?

Thursday:

Read Romans 1:25. The apostle Paul identifies the source of all injustice. What is it? How are Adam and Eve in Genesis 3 examples of such injustice?

Friday:

At its root, all injustice is misplaced worship. What do you think of this idea? In what ways might you struggle with misplaced worship? What might need to change, and how can you make the needed change?
