# For Reflection and Application:

### Monday:

Read I Corinthians 15:3-5. It is likely that Paul is here reciting the earliest creed in the history of Christianity. According to I Corinthians 15:1, it has to do with the gospel. According to this creed, what are some important parts of the gospel?

#### Tuesday:

According to Paul, how important is the gospel articulated in 1 Corinthians 15:3-5?

### Wednesday:

Read Galatians 1:6-10. How concerned is Paul about mixing the gospel with other things? What might motivate someone to mix the gospel with other things (see verse 10).

## Thursday:

What is the danger in mixing social justice with the gospel?

#### Friday:

In your opinion, what is it about our culture that tempts us to elevate social justice to a first thing and thereby diminish the gospel?

#### **Daily Prayer:**

Lord, thank you for the gospel of Jesus Christ. Help me to do justice in a way that does not diminish or distort in any way this good news. Amen.
