2 Corinthians 6:1 Working together with him, then, we appeal to you not to receive the grace of God in vain. 2 For he says, "In a favorable time I listened to you, and in a day of salvation I have helped you." Behold, now is the favorable time; behold, now is the day of salvation. 3 We put no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, 4 but as servants of God we commend ourselves in every way: by great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, 5 beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, sleepless nights, hunger; 6 by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, the Holy Spirit, genuine love; 7 by truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; 8 through honor and dishonor, through slander and praise. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; 9 as unknown, and yet well known; as dying, and behold, we live; as punished, and yet not killed; 10 as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, yet possessing everything. ESV

SERMON NOTES

2 Corinthians 6:3 We put no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, 4 but as servants of God we commend ourselves in every way.... ESV

For Reflection and Application:

Monday:

Read 2 Corinthians 6:1. How is it possible for a believer to "receive the grace of God in vain"?

Tuesday:

Read 2 Corinthians 6:2. How does this quote from Isaiah 49:8 relate to what Paul is saying?

Wednesday:

Read 2 Corinthians 6:3-10. In what ways is it possible for us to put an obstacle in someone's way? (See also Acts 15:19 and 1 Corinthians 9:12.)

Thursday:

In 2 Corinthians 6:4, Paul tells us we are to commend ourselves as servants of God? How can we do that?

Friday:

In light of 2 Corinthians 6:1-10, prayerfully ask the Lord show you the answers to these questions: Am I receiving the grace of God in vain? Am I working together with others in my church to bring life to our community? Am I living more like a servant or an obstacle?

Daily Prayer:

Lord, thank you for the grace I have received. Help me not respond to it in vain. Show me the ways I may be living like an obstacle. And help me to live as your servant instead, bringing your life to others, come what may. Amen.
