For Reflection and Application:

Monday:

Read Psalm 118:22-24 In verse 22, what do the various aspects of the building metaphor represent? The builders? The stone? The structure? Why is the cornerstone important?

Tuesday:

Read Matthew 21:33-42. In the parable about the son, who does the son represent? Who do the tenants represent? How does this parable relate to Jesus's quotation of Psalm 118:2-3 in Matthew 21:42? What point was Jesus making?

Wednesday:

Read Acts 4:8-12. To whom is Peter speaking? Who is the Cornerstone? How does this clarify the importance of the Cornerstone?

Thursday:

Read Ephesians 2:19-21. What is the building for which Jesus is the Cornerstone? If you are a believer, what is your part in it?

Friday:

Reread Psalm 118:24. What is "the day"? Who made it? Why and how should you choose to rejoice and be glad in it?

Daily Prayer:

Lord, help us to see the day a new way,
to rise above the daily grind to holy
ground, where we can see that this is
the day that you have made, the day of
our salvation. Help us to rejoice and be
glad in it. Amen.
